### Voting now open for Barossa, Light and Lower North Fund My Idea

Voting is now open for the Barossa, Light and Lower North round of 'Fund My Idea'.

Regional Development Minister Geoff Brock said 41 ideas for community projects were now online to be considered for funding of up to \$50,000 as part of the Regional Development Fund's Country Cabinet Program.

"We've seen some great local ideas put forward for funding across the Barossa, Light, Gawler and Mallala council areas," Mr Brock said.

"Now's your time to vote – visit the YourSAy website and have your say on what project or projects you think should receive funding.

"Voting is open until 5pm Wednesday 16 December.

"The top three ideas will be assessed once voting closes and the winners announced shortly afterwards.

"This is your opportunity to make a difference and help decide where the funding is directed," Mr Brock said.

"Projects awarded funding through the regional initiative of 'Fund My Idea' are all ideas put forward by locals to benefit their communities.

"Funded projects around the State so far have included a new active learning space at St Joseph's School in Renmark, the fit-out of a performing arts studio catering for children with special needs in Mount Barker, empowering Aboriginal youth with digital journalism skills in Ceduna, and a community gym at the Burra Community School.

"\$50,000 is available through the Country Cabinet 'Fund My Idea' program for each area hosting a Country Cabinet meeting," Mr Brock said.

Premier Jay Weatherill and Cabinet Ministers visited the Barossa, Light and Lower North area from October 18-20 with a public forum held in Nuriootpa on Sunday October 18.
