Young trainees from the councils of Murray Bridge, Mid Murray and the Adelaide Hills are meeting in Murray Bridge today for networking and professional development – one of a statewide series of events as part of the State Government's Regional Youth Traineeship Program.

The 'Welcome to Local Government Induction' events are designed specifically for the trainees and their supervisors, and participants today will be meeting face to face with other trainees from the region, undertaking professional development, and hearing from local role models

Background

The Regional Youth Traineeship Program is a \$2 million Regional Development initiative through the Jobs Accelerator Fund, delivered on behalf of the State Government by the Local Government Association.

The 57 trainees from across South Australia are young people aged between 17 and 24 living in the regions who were unemployed or didn't have a full time job.

Trainees benefit from tailored training and work plans so on completion of their two year traineeship they will be ready to take advantage of further employment opportunities.

The program has been designed to encourage the regional local governing bodies to continue employing the trainees after the two funded years.
