# New trainees get their first taste of Local Government

Young trainees from the Adelaide Hills, Fleurieu Peninsula and Kangaroo Island will today attend their first induction as part of the State Government's \$4 million Regional Youth Traineeship Program.

The *Welcome to Local Government Induction* event in Goolwa is the first of a series of inductions across South Australia designed specifically for program trainees and supervisors.

The 12 trainees attending the induction today are part of 57 Round 2 inductees bringing the total number of trainees recruited under the program across the State to 114.

They will meet face-to-face and hear from Round 1 trainee and NAIDOC and Young Citizen of the Year Award winner Ashleigh Darrie on how the program benefits starting a career in the regions.

#### **Background**

The Regional Youth Traineeship Program is a \$4 million Regional Development initiative delivered on behalf of the State Government by the Local Government Association.

The 114 trainees from South Australia are young people aged between 17 and 24 living in the regions who were either unemployed or didn't work full time.

Participants benefit from tailored training and work plans, so on completion of their two-year traineeships, they'll be ready to take advantage of further employment opportunities.

The program has been designed to encourage the regional local governing bodies to continue employing the trainees after the two funded years.
