It was also the district's first High School, and a hall for the Druids and Rechabite Lodge groups.

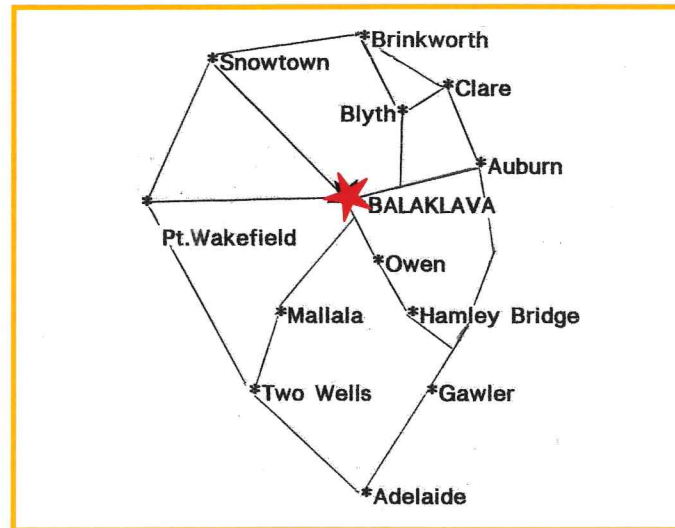
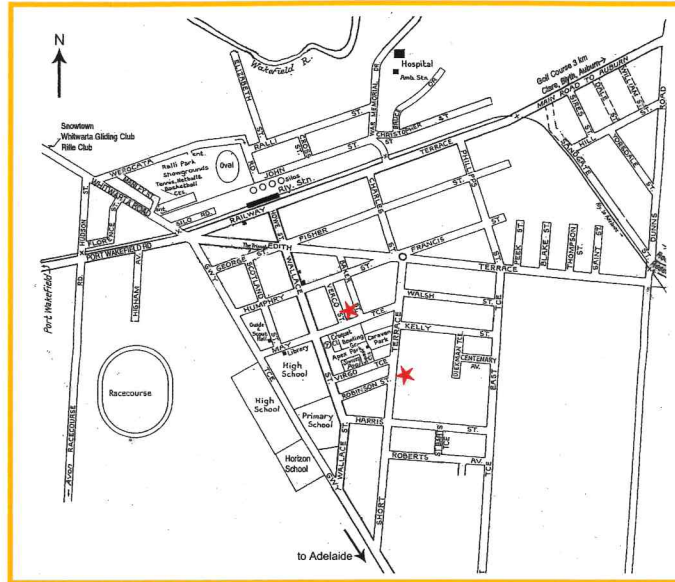
Urlwin Park

Urlwin Park, once a large poultry farm, was bequeathed by Mr Lyle Urlwin, with the hope it would be suitable to house and display historic memorabilia.

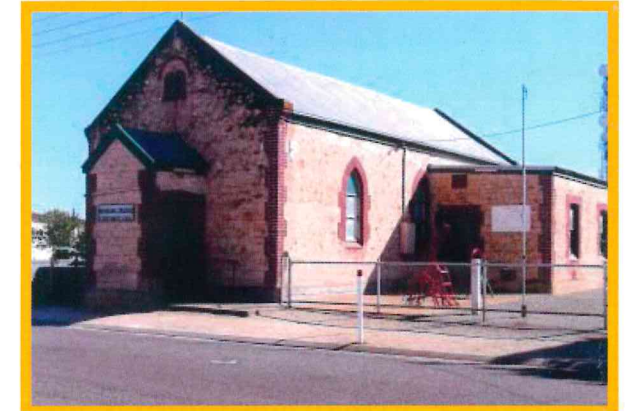
MAP OF BALAKLAVA
